- **Go for the popular types** – get picky about the online dating site you sign up to by researching and choosing a well-known site. A quick check of their database size will help you suss out how many fish are in the sea.
- **It all began with an... email** – create a separate email account for your online dating profile and choose an email address and profile name that doesn't include personally identifiable information and isn't linked to your Facebook or place of employment.
- **Sealed with a kiss (and a scam)** – Internet scams can easily turn a love story into a nightmare, so ignore any junk mail that lands in your online dating inbox. Never send money or offer financial assistance to anyone you've met online and report anyone who has asked you to hand over cash or other valuable goods.
